# **STATE OF THE CHURCH REPORT**

As I was thinking about the current state of Chalfont the words "under construction" kept coming to mind. We've spent the past few years digging the footers as we've prayed about becoming the prayer/retreat center God is calling us to be.

We believe we are being called to embody the words of Jesus in John 14: 12, "The one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father" (NRSV) and also Matthew 11:28 -29, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (NRSV). We know this isn't something that happens overnight. Through discussions centering on the best way for us to move forward we have identified four keys areas we want to address before the 2015 Charge Conference.

**1. We know that if we are going to be successful that God needs to be the main support**. Therefore we need to develop a solid biblical foundation. One way we have begun to build this is through a church-wide study from beginning to end of the Bible- called The Story. This journey began Sept 7, 2014 and continues through May 3, 2015. We are hoping to get everyone involved in this study. Sunday school lessons are provided for all ages from our youngest in the nursery through adults. Small group studies are being offered as well as suggestions for activities for families to do during the week.

2. Along with a solid foundation every building should have strong structural columns in place before the building is constructed. In the coming year we want to identify our 3 core values along with developing an organizational/administrative/leadership structure that will support our mission rather than trying to make the mission/vision support the structure (*while staying within the guidelines in the 2012 Discipline*). The current system has become unwieldy and cumbersome. We have many vacant positions and many of our folks are serving on numerous committees. Planning the administrative structure around the mission/vision will provide stronger structural support allowing us to be more effective and better equipped to handle the challenges and opportunities we face.

3. **Much of our vision includes developing the outside of the property into sacred space.** Therefore, our goal is to bring a professional landscaper on board to assist us in designing the blueprint for the development of the grounds along with some cost estimates so that we can create a timeline and plan for the development of the property.

4. Finally, as we live into and become a prayer and retreat center we want to create greater visibility and marketing strategies including a logo and other branding ideas.

So please - "pardon our dust."....
