# "PARDON OUR DUST...continues"

Last year as I was thinking about the current state of Chalfont the words "under construction" kept coming to mind. We've spent the past few years digging the footers as we've prayed about becoming the prayer/ retreat center God is calling us to be. That continues to be the case this year as we move into 2016.

One of the main items our Church Council worked on this year was to revise our Administrative/Leadership structure. It took longer to put together than we anticipated. It is now finished and being presented for approval at our 2015 Charge Conference. This new system will allow us to have a structure that will support our mission rather than trying to make the mission work within the current structure. The current system has become a burden. We have had many positions vacant and many of our folks serving in multiple roles. (The proposal was passed at Charge Conference to go to one leadership board – a copy of the proposal was provided in a previous issue of the newsletter. Copies are available from the church office.) A copy of the proposal is included in the Charge Conference forms. We also took a year and did a church-wide Bible study called The Story. It provided a comprehensive study of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. This fall we have embarked on a new study of the Bible. We Make the Road by Walking will again take us from Genesis to Revelation but with a different perspective. Author Brian McLaren describes his approach as being - "free to ask any questions about the Bible - to 'kick its tires,' so to speak, applying critical thinking to the Biblical texts as we would any other documents.... Many of us have walked the road of our tradition to where it currently ends, and we've come to believe that the road isn't finished yet" (http://www.huffingtonpost.com/.../why-i-wrote-we-make-the-r b...). I believe these studies are an important part of our construction process and encourage us to grow deeper in our relationship with God. We want to make sure that God is the foundation for all that we are doing.

As we move into another year we believe we are still being called to embody the words of Jesus in John 14: 12, "The one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father" (NRSV) and also Matthew 11:28 -29, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (NRSV). Continuing our discussions on the best way for us to move forward we have identified three keys areas we want to address before our 2016 Charge Conference.

*1.* We are putting together an "Outdoor Spaces" team and hoping to get at least one outside project started. In order for this to happen, we need to review the two design landscape proposals we received earlier in the year and put together a comprehensive design plan for the property. We also need to meet and work with Chalfont Borough officials for approval of these plans.

2. We will begin to train our congregation and leadership in prayer and healing ministries. This will be done through small group studies, workshops and seminars. We will contact Washington Crossing UMC to see if they would be able to support and perhaps mentor us in these areas of ministries. They are a large United Methodist Church that operates in the physical gifts of the Spirit. They have numerous prayer and healing ministries as well as numerous prayer/healing rooms in their facility.

3. One goal we were unable to complete last year was to identify our three core values. Therefore, it will be one of our goals again this year.

So once again, we ask, please - "pardon our dust."....
