WE MAKE THE ROAD BY WALKING

Have you ever noticed the walking paths in public places? Some of them are hardscaped and you know right where you are "supposed" to walk. Have you also noticed that along with these pre-determined paths or roads there are often dirt paths where the grass has died because people have chosen to go a different way. Someone made the decision to go a different way, to forge a new path, to take the road less traveled and "that has made all the difference." Because someone was willing to try something new and go a different way a new path or road became available providing an alternative.

Chalfont UMC is in the process of creating a new path, a new road, a new way of being church. We are exploring new possibilities and seeking to develop our unfilled potential as we live into our calling to be a prayer/healing and retreat center. We want to provide a different and meaningful way for people to experience God and find rest and healing for their souls.

Not only are we continuing to make new physical roads/paths and spaces together but we are also committed to growing spiritually, making our relationship with God and each other even stronger. "We Make the Road by Walking" will be our 2015/2016 theme with our new sermon series starting on September 13. It is based on the book by the same title by Brian McLaren. Like The Story last year we'll start with Genesis and work our way through the Bible. McLaren brings a refreshing and inspiring perspective to the biblical narrative. Each week will be an invitation to consider familiar biblical texts in a new light. I hope you will find this study challenging and engaging.

McLaren's belief is that "faith was never intended to be a destination, a status, a holding tank, or a warehouse. Instead, it was to be a road, a path, a way out of old and destructive patterns into new and creative ones. As a road or way, it is always being extended into the future. If a spiritual community only points back to where it has been or if it only digs in its heels where it is now, it is a dead end or a parking lot, not a way. To be a living tradition, a living way, it must forever open itself forward and forever remain unfinished – even as it forever cherishes and learns from the growing treasury of its past" (We Make the Road by Walking, Jericho Books, © 2014, xii).

Our new road is just getting started. Autumn is a beautiful time to be outdoors and enjoying God's creation. There is a beautiful world waiting to be explored. Actually, you don't have to leave the neighborhood – we've got seven acres of beautiful property and community trails connected to the property right here at Chalfont UMC that are waiting to be explored. Put on your walking shoes and come over. Come be part of the trail blazing adventure and together "we will make the road by walking."


LEADERSHIP PROPOSAL
