These are the lyrics of the chorus from "Theme from Mahogany." The song is from the 1975 movie Mahogany. It is the story of the life of one woman's quest to become a famous fashion designer. The questions being asked in this song are ones that we have been asking ourselves this year at Chalfont UMC as we talk about what it means and what it takes for us to "Live into Our Destinies."

Like the young woman in the movie, we are all on a quest. Everyone is looking for something. It might be approval, money, fame, fortune, security, happiness and well the list can go on and on. The problem is that many of us just plod or trudge drearily through life. We keep doing the same things day after day and if we are not careful we will find ourselves sinking in our same—old ruts and routines. Our minds, bodies and souls will begin to shrivel.

Life is more than just work. We are especially reminded of this as we watch the children play outside during the long warm days of summer. Remember – even God rested on the seventh day. I like the way Joan Chittister expresses this idea in her book *Illuminated Life: Monastic Wisdom for Seekers of Life.* She writes: "Re-creation, holy leisure, is the mainstay of the ... soul, and the theology of Sabbath is its cornerstone. 'On the seventh day,' scripture says, 'God rested.' With that single image, that one line of Holy Writ, reflection, recreation of the creative spirit, transcendence, the right to be bigger than we do, is sanctified (102)".

Summer is a good time to evaluate our lives, to spend some time reflecting on the impact our life is having on us, on those around us and even on those who will be coming after us. Are we making a positive difference in the lives of others? But summer is also an important time for rest, renewal and recreation.

The last verse of the song reads:

Now looking back at all we've had
We let so many dreams just slip through our hands
Why must we wait so long, before we see?
How sad the answers to those questions can be

Life is not meant to be dull, dreary and depressing. Life is a journey. It is an adventure. It's what we make of it. And let's face it – this life is all we have while on this earth. So - what are you making of yours? Do you know where you're going to?

It is summer. It's time to rest. It's time to play. Now - grab a friend, go outside and throw a couple of water balloons!!
