Ladies room toilet (water leak in middle stall) – handyman

Men's room toilet (wobbly/loose, not leaking) - handyman

Men's room toilet running (needs new insides) - handyman

Water heater leak (need to hire plumber to assess repairs)

Library baseboards to be replaced (*due to water leak*)

Fix globe over light outside the kitchen

Parsonage auto garage door (needs repaired or replaced)

SANCTUARY CARPET

The carpet in the sanctuary has become one of the most important projects sponsored by the Trustees. It is buckled and cannot be repaired. There is a considerable concern that someone could trip and fall while walking in the sanctuary. Thus it is necessary to replace the carpet (not including the altar area) as soon as possible

As most of you now know, CUMC has created a Carpet Replacement Fund to raise the money for the carpet. \$7000.00 is needed - and in true CUMC form we have already received \$4,370,00 from the congregation. A big thank you for this successful response to our need.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 28 - OUR YOUTH MINISTRY HAS BEGUN

We call our group SLY (Spirit Led Youth) and we meet at the Cafe Connection (which is the basement at Chalfont UMC) on Sunday evenings at 6:30 pm until 8:00 pm (doors open at 6:00 pm). All children in both congregations and in the local community are invited (if they are in 6th through 12th grades).

The leaders of our new youth ministry program are: Dave and Sue Cody, Greg Ehrenzeller, Louise Peardon, Colleen Lester (Montgomery Square) and of course, Pastor Vicky. This group has gotten together and transfored the basement at CUMC into a youth friendly place. In addition they have made plans to keep the kids busy every Sunday evening with diverse and kid-friendly programs - until the summer break. (Easter Sunday - no meeting.) And, don't forget there is a Biblical part to the evening (The book of Proverbs will be discussed during spring 2021.)

Parenting during this current era of technology is a tough job under normal circumstances! The Methodist Youth Fellowship (as it was called back in the day) has always been a ministry to assist parents in guiding youth to the right path. The wrong choices during the young impressionable teen years can be devasting. Teenagers today are dealing with more stress and in danger of engaging in riskier behaviors than ever before. Technology makes them more vulnerable to being misled or finding themselves dealing with so much duress. An active M.Y.F. can be very helpful to parents.

"It attracted me to the church as a teen, and in many ways, it saved my life. Back in the early 1970's, as a teen I had two sets of friends. Those I met in church, and those who influenced me in the wrong direction (you do remember the wild 70's?). Fifty years later, I look back and realize that today I am still in touch with many of the youth I met in the church. Our lives all seem to be going well. Later this year, I will preside over the ceremony of matrimony for two from our old youth group, Jeff and Tricia (Trish is my 1st cousin). The lives of the group of youth I hung with on the outside of the church however had much different outcomes. Unfortunately, many did not survive the paths they mistakenly pursued in life. PV"
