Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As many of you know the 2019 Special Session of General Conference has completed its work. Eight hundred and sixty-four United Methodist delegates from across the United States, Africa, Europe and Philippines met in St. Louis from Feb. 24-26 to consider paragraphs of The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and ministry to LGBTQI persons.

The General Conference voted against the One Church Plan recommended by the majority of our church's bishops. The General Conference instead passed the Traditional Plan, which maintains the denomination's ban on same-sex marriage and prohibition on the ordination of self-avowed practicing homosexuals with additional accountability for enforcing those policies. The constitutionality of key points within the Traditional Plan has been called into question and will be reviewed by the Judicial Council in April.

I am grateful for the prayers of all of you for our church and our delegates. Some of you may be pleased or relieved by the decisions made by the conference while others are in deep pain and anguish. I particularly want to acknowledge the pain this has caused our LGBTQI brothers and sisters along with their families and loved ones. Please know that you are a beloved child of God and member of our church community. You are both invited and welcomed to participate in our ministries.

United Methodists are members of a global and diverse denomination and are clearly not of one mind on questions around human sexuality. In spite of our differences, we are all children of God. At a time in which our society is becoming increasing polarized, my hope is still that the church can be a place where people of different backgrounds, cultures and opinions will come together.

The effects of the General Conference's decisions on the denomination are still being determined. None of the legislation will become church law until January 1, 2020. I encourage each of you to give yourselves time to process and heal and continue to offer love to each other. We will continue our vital ministry and seek to be a community that welcomes and loves all people. As we learn more, we will discuss next steps together. I encourage everyone to be in prayer over the next few months for our church, our denomination and for all those who are scared or hurting. My door is always open if you need to talk or pray with someone. Let us continue to process this together. May we all continue to love one another as Christ loves us.

BOILER REPLACEMENT

Recently, we have discovered that one of the two boilers that provide heat for our building needs to be replaced. We are in a holding pattern at the moment, hoping that a temporary fix will hold until the coldest weather is finished to give us time to raise most of the funds required. We will wait until the fall to do the work if possible. The estimate is between \$15,000-\$18,000. Several fund raising events have been planned:

1. Bertucci's – This was on February 19-20 and gave us 25% back on meals served if a special coupon was used. We received \$130.00 from the Bertucci's fund raiser.

2. Hoagie Sale – The UMM will be having a fund raiser for the boiler fund on June 1st. Presales will be during most of May. Please spread the word and sell hoagies to all your friends and relatives. Our hoagies (*turkey and Italian*) always receive rave reviews.

3. Applebee's Flapjack breakfast – This year our annual pancake breakfast will be on Saturday, October 26th at the Applebee's in Montgomeryville. Tickets will be available starting September 29th. Please bring your extended families and friends for a great "all you can eat" pancake breakfast and help us raise money for the boiler!

As of March 6, we have collected \$4,131.00 toward the project. Many thanks to those who have contributed. Please help any way you can, by direct contribution, attending the fund-raisers, or participating in the activities.

JOIN US ON OUR 2019 LENTEN JOURNEY

This year our Lenten journey began on Wednesday, March 6th (Ash Wednesday).

Lent is that 40 day period before Easter. Historically, it has been a time for personal reflection, introspection and spiritual renewal as we join Christ on his walk to the cross. (Sundays are not included since each Sunday is a celebration and remembrance of Christ's resurrection.) During Lent we are challenged to think about our own walk with Christ. We are encouraged to think about who we are today and who we want to be.

This year we are going to be looking at the disciple Peter. Peter is the most famous of the disciples and one that many of us can relate too! He was passionate, but often spoke without thinking. He was afraid and confused. He was also courageous and at times did the impossible.

On Thursday evenings during Lent we will be using Adam Hamilton's "Simon Peter: Flawed but Faithful Disciple Video Study." In this DVD study Rev. Hamilton will help us take an in-depth look into the life and faith of Peter while on location in Israel and Italy showing us key sites in the life of Peter.
